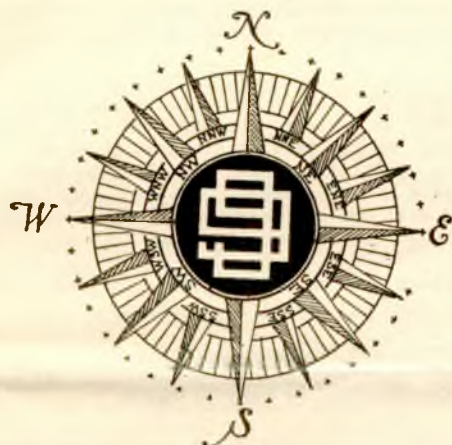

EDITORIAL

ALL Ninety-Nines, attention! We ask your aid
for your Sister Flyers!

The recent termination of recruiting and training of additional Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) is a matter of sincere regret to all women pilots. This project opened opportunities for women in aviation which have never before been available and offered women pilots a chance to prove that their performance on military aircraft equalled that of male pilots.

Unfortunately many girls who had been accepted for the June 30th class did not know of its cancellation until they reached Sweetwater, since telegrams notifying them of the order arrived, in many cases, too late.

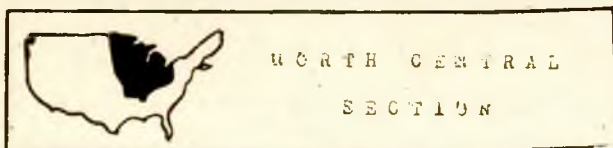
All Ninety-Nines should be cognizant of the facts leading to this cancellation. The Costello Bill, H. R. 4219, to give military status to the WASP was reported favorably by the House Military Affairs Committee. Subsequent to that report but prior to debate on the floor of the House, the Ramspeck Civil Service Committee issued a report on an investigation of the WASP program which it had conducted, recommending immediate discontinuance of training, except for those already enrolled. Shortly thereafter, H. R. 4219 was killed by vote of the House.

The WASPs have been doing a commendable job for the Army Air Forces and it was the desire to continue with the WASP training program as well as to give military status to this group. The recommendations of the Ramspeck Committee and the tenor of the debate on the House floor, however, left no alternative but immediate termination of the WASP recruiting and training program. It would appear that there is no chance for the hundreds of qualified girls who had applied for this service unless favorable Congressional action is forth coming in the future.

In an effort to obtain favorable Congressional action for the reinstatement of the WASP program, we urge each Ninety-Nine to write, and ask her friends to write, to (1) Congressman Robert Ramspeck (Ga.), Washington, D. C.; (2) Congressman John M. Costello (Calif.), Washington, D. C., and (3) Her own Senators and Representatives.

DO THIS NOW. DON'T DELAY. Woman pilots have worked long and hard for this opportunity. Help them win out. Some day you may need their help.

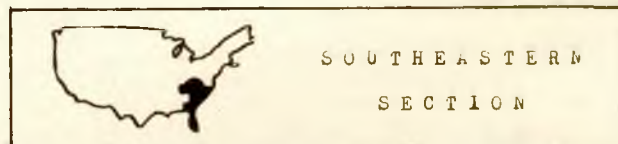

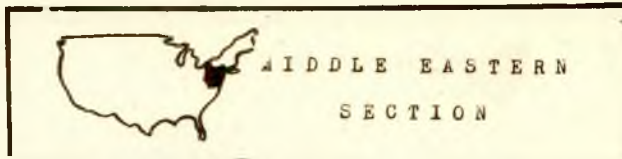
A Link operator just told us about a student whose only trouble in radio work was "an airlock between the earphones."

Here's a plea from all grounded in the East and West Coasts restricted areas, addressed to Senators, Representatives, Army, Navy, CAA, and whoever else we can think of:

OPEN THE AIRPORTS NOW - NOT TOMORROW, OR NEXT MONTH OR NEXT YEAR, BUT NOW. We want to be able to fly without wearing out our tires and selves by traveling 40 or 60 or 100 miles to get a ship. If necessary, restrict pilots and student pilots in these areas to those either investigated by FBI or holding CAP and CAPC memberships, BUT GIVE US A BREAK AND PUT US BACK IN THE AIR AGAIN. It is true that some airports are operating under CAP in these areas, but we need more airports and less restriction. Give the private operator a chance to resume private operations. OPEN UP THE AIRPORTS.

Dear Editor:

May I suggest that an item be included in the next Ninety Nine News Letter concerning the ill-fated June 30 WASP class? By now Ninety-niners have heard how members of this class reported under orders to Avenger Field, Sweetwater, Texas, to find upon arrival that their class had been cancelled. It is well known that these women had undertaken flight training at their own expense at great personal sacrifice in most instances, had given up jobs, had sacrificed planes in some instances, and other possessions, in order to contribute their efforts to this phase of war work.

It is to the interest of all women in aviation that the WASPS be permitted to continue training, aside from the rather unfair circumstances surrounding the June 30 class. Could it be urged that women pilots, aspiring WASPS, and their friends, wire and communicate with their congressmen, requesting they contact General Arnold and asking him to reinstate the cancelled June 30 class, appropriation for which is now available? Congressmen should further be asked that they consider fa-

vorably any measure which might concern the WASP program, should it again arise when Congress reconvenes, inasmuch as the program has proved worthwhile, releasing men for more active flight duty outside the United States, and it has General Arnold's outspoken approval. The discriminatory action instigated by Mr. Ramspeck with the backing of W.T.S. groups should certainly be reconsidered.

I hope it will be possible to include an item on this vital topic in the coming News Letter.

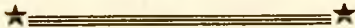
