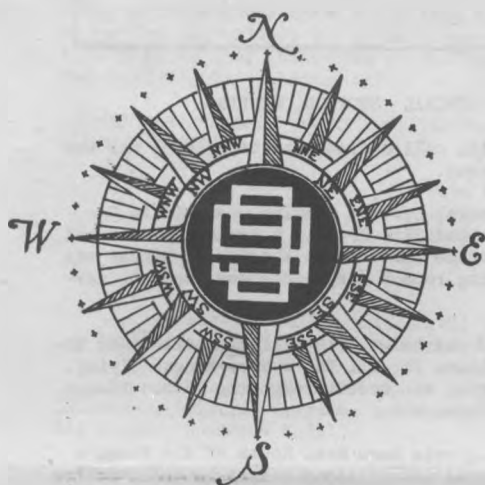

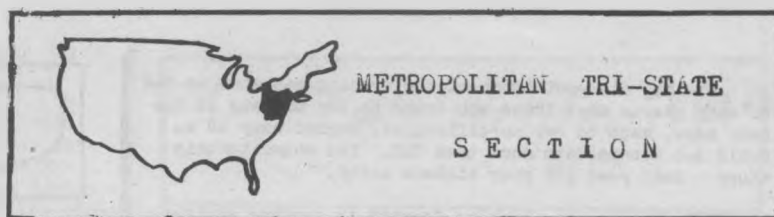

FIFTEENTH ANNIVERSARY

The Fifteenth Anniversary of the founding of the Ninety-Nines, November 2, 1944, was the occasion of a testimonial dinner to the charter members given by the New York-New Jersey Chapter, which was held in the Garden Room of the Ambassador Hotel, New York. Eleven of the original members were able to be with us and were presented by our Governor, Marjorie White. They were Margaret Cooper, Viola Gentry, Betty Gillies, Teddy Kenyon, Eleanor Lay, Dorothy Leh, Marjorie Lesser, Ruth Nichols, Blanche Noyes, Peggy Remy, Nancy Tiers, and a last minute cancellation from Louise Thaden.

Casey Jones was our Master of Ceremonies and introduced several of our guests among whom were General Haines, U.S.A., Captain Weems, U.S.N., Sherman Fairchild, Carrol Cone of Pan American Airways, Roger Wolfe Kahn, John Heinmuller, Nancy Love, Helen Ritchie, Governor Harwood of the Virgin Islands, several Wasps from Newark Airport and many, many others. We were sorry that Jackie Cochran could not be with us but she was represented by Mr. Floyd Odium and his party.

We had no formal speech making except to present Dome Harwood with a large pair of white wings, which sat high upon his shoulders, to thank him for the guidance he has offered to so many of our girls. Sid Nesbit, of Lear Radio, sang a song written for women pilots "Jenny Is a High Flyer Now" which was so well received Mr. Nesbit continued singing and accompanied himself on his guitar. He brought the house down. We also had a quiz program called "Cross Control, Please" in which Mr. Nesbit as M.C., tried to stump the board of aviation experts composed of Blanche Noyes, Harry Bruno, Casey Jones and Franklin Kurt. Rhoda Hall and Sid Nesbit did some dual piano numbers which were, needless to say, better than any by our well known concert teams.

Each of the charter members was presented with a gift and a copy of a book recording the founding and history of the Ninety-Nines, specially printed for the evening.

The big disappointment of the evening was that we had so many guests that those who tried to buy tickets at the door were, much to our mortification, turned away as we could not accommodate more than 210. The moral to this story - next year get your tickets early.

All who came are looking forward to another anniversary party, and we hope that many of you will be able to join with us.

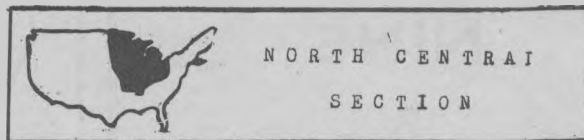

GOVERNOR'S NOTICE

ATTENTION! All Chapter officers in Middle Eastern Section -- All chapter members:

The Section Governor requests that all Chapters in this Section hold a business meeting of their chapter some time in February. Most of you wandering members should be home by then and it is imperative that chapters organize and get into running shape. Many new members have never had a chance to attend a meeting. It shall be the responsibility of last elected chapter officers to get together and arrange this February meeting for their respective chapters. It shall be the responsibility of every chapter member to see that this is done. Chapters which have not held election for 1944-1945 officers shall do so at this meeting.

For the benefit of new members, Middle Eastern Section consists of the following chapters: Eastern Penn, (which includes Delaware members); Western Penn, Washington, D. C., (It is suggested that Maryland members meet with Washington, D. C., Chapter until they can organize a regular Maryland Chapter, which they should do at the earliest possible moment.); West Virginia Chapter. Virginia 99'ers, meet with West Virginia until your chapter has been obtained.

The 99 Constitution states: "Local chapter may be formed at the desire of members, not less than five active members being necessary for the formation of a chapter." In practise it has been found that it is better to start with ten or more members.

At the last listing in 1943-1944, Maryland had approximately six members residing in that area. Some Maryland members are working outside that area. Virginia and Delaware at present do not have enough permanent resident 99'ers to make it advisable to start a chapter.

Total of Section members is now approximately 77. divided as follows:

Eastern Penn, including Delaware,	35
Western Penn	15
Washington, D.C., including Maryland,	18
West Virginia, including Virginia,	11.

Elected Chapter Reporters shall send in to the NEWS LETTER a report of their respective chapters February meeting, together with a list of their Chapter officers for September, 1944, to September, 1945

All Chapters shall arrange to hold meetings once a month beginning with February.

It is further suggested that all South Jersey members of the New York-New Jersey Section, who find it difficult to get to New York City meetings, may attend as guest members the meetings of Eastern Penn, though they vote and retain active membership in their own Section. 99'er Betty Montgomery, Merchantville, N. J., is asked to bring prospective South Jersey 99'ers to our Eastern Penn meetings. She will receive our regular meeting notices.
