## GONSTITUTION OF THE NINETY-NINES

## FORETARD

The purpose of this organisation is to provide a close relationship among women pilots and to unite them in any movement that may be for their benefit or for that of aviation in general.

## ARTICLE <br> I

NALE
The name of this organization shall be The Ninety-fines, or $99^{\prime} \mathrm{s}$, this numeral representing the charter membership.

## ARTICLE II <br> MTKNRERSHIP

Section 1. (a) The membership of this body shall be composed of all its sections in the United States and foreign countries. An applicant shall join the 99 Club by eritering the seotion in which she resides.
(b) A member who has changed her residence shall present to the chairman of the chapter orgenized to cover the territory into which sho moves, or, if no such chapter exists, to the governor of the section into which she moves, a letter of transfer from the chairman of the chapter from which she moves, or, if no such chapter exists, fram the governor of the seotion from which she moves. Said letter of transfer shall be acted upon by membership oomittee of the ohepter into whose territory she moves, or, if no such chapter exiats, by the membership committee or the seotion into which she moves, and, if approved by said membership committee, wuoh action shall establish her as member thereof.
Section 2. The membership of this Club shall be divided into the following classes;
Class A--Active
Class B---Inactive
Class C---Life Members
Class D---Honorary
(a) ACTIVE MEMBERS. Any woman holding a current pilot's license or certificate of higher than solo grade or its equivalent in any country may on recommendation of the chapter membership committee, or, if no chepter exists, may on recommendation of the seotion menbership committee become an ACTIVE member, which admits to all privileges and duties of the club including voting and holding office.
(b) INACTIVE MEMBERS. Any Aotive Menber whose certificate has lapsed and who has had not less than 200 hours of oertified solo time may become an Inactive Member. Inactive Members shall pay dues but may not vote or hold office.

Any Active Hember whose oertificate has lapsed and who has had less than 200 oertified solo hours shall become an Inactive Member until the end of the fiscal year for which her dues have been paid. If at that time her certificate has not been reinstated, her mambership in the organization will terminata. She may be reinstated to ACTIVE membership, upon reinstatement of her pilot's certificate, through the regular channels of written application for membership by vote of the chapter membership cormittee, or if no chapter exists, by vote of the section membership oomittee.

Any former Active Member may by vote of the Executive Committee become an Inactive Momber upon loss of certificate resulting from accidental injuries or circumstances beyond human control.
(c) LIFE MLMBERS. Any Active or Inactive member may become a Life Member of the 99 Club with all rights and privileges of an Active Member, except to hold office, by the payment of one hundred dollars ( $\$ 100.00$ ) into the National Treasury. Life Members shall be exempt from the payment of dues. The moneys paid in by Life Members shall be invested by the Executive Comittee of the Club and only the income therefrom shall be used for association expenses.

Any former or present Active Member who has served in the office of President of the Club shall be awarded Life Membership in the Ninety-Nines. In this case she shall-be exempt from payment of $\$ 100.00$. She may accept this Life Membership any time she chooses.
(d) HONORARY MMMBERS. On recommendation of the Exeoutive Committee outstanding women-who are or have been active in aviation may be eleoted Honorary Members at the Annal Meating. Honorary Members shall be exempt from dues but may not vote.
(e) MEMBERS AT LARGE. An applicant residing in a foreign country in which no Seotion has been organized may join the club when approved by the brecutive committee and will be considered a Member At Large.
Section 3. At no time may a person become a member of the NINETY-NINES, unless recomended by the ohapter membership comitte日, or if no chapter exists, by the section membership committee, and unless she meets the requirements and agrees to the following:

Any female citizen of the United States or of foreign oountries shall by vote of the chapter membership committee, or, if no ohapter exists, by vote of the section membership coumittee, be eligible for membership in this organization, if she is of good character, and if, upon making her application she can show satisfactary evidence of the following:
(a) That she holds a current Department of Commarce pilot' $\mathrm{a}_{\mathrm{c}}$ certiflcate of Private or higher grade for hesvier or lighter than air craft, or a corresponding certificate issued by the country of which she is a citizen.
(b) That she agrees to abide by the Constitution and By-Laws of this organization, in ciuding Section 5 of this Article, providing for the termination of mombership in the Club for any of the causes set forth, without recourse againgt the 99 Club or any officer or member thereof.

Seotion 4. Any member who shall not havo paid dues three months aftor they are payable shall be dropped from the organisation, the Seoretary notifying such members of termination of mombership. To be reinatated, application may be sent to the membership comitteo in the usual way.

## TERMTIATION OF METMBERSHIP

seotion 5. TERMINATION OF MGNBERSHIP. Tho Exeoutive Comitteo nay rocomond the disqualifiontion of an applicant or dimies a member if they have cuuse to beliove she is of objeotionable character or by any act has brought disoredit to the linety-lines and if such notion has beon requestod by a twothird vote of the seotion or chapter in which such applicant or member resides.
Seotion 6. When a member is dismiseed the Governor shall notify the chepter of the seotion end the Fetional Seoretary.

## ARTICLE III <br> LEETINGS

Section 1. This Club shall meet annually at a time and place to be fixed by the Executive Committoe. The Secretary shall send to all members thirty days before the Annual Meeting written notices, stating the place, day, hour and object of the meetinge

## FISCAL YEAR

Section 2. The Fiscal Year of this Club shall begin September first and close August 31st of each year.

## ARTICLE IV

REPRESENTATION AND RIGHTS OF MEMBERS
Section 1. Each seotion shall be represented at the Annual Mational Meeting by delogates composed of the Governor of each section and one delegate for each trenty members or major fraction thereof from each chapter, providing that each chapter shall have at least one delegate. Every member may attend the Annual Meeting and take part in discussion but only delegates may vote.
Section 2. Delegates must be members in good standing.
Section 3. All members in good standing of Class A and C shall be entitied to cast one vote in person or by mail for the election of each of the officers. Each member is represented at the Annual Business Moeting by her Sootion's Governor and by delegates oleoted by ohapters.
Section 4. The Club Magazine shall be sent to members without additional charge.

## $\frac{\text { ARTICLE } V}{\text { OFFICERS }}$

Section 1. The elective officers shall consist of a President, Vice-Fresidnt, a Secretary and a Treasuren. Section 2. The officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the ballots received, for a term of one your. If no one receives a majority vote for an office, the delegates shall proceed to elect. officers must be members in good standing.
Section 3. No officer shall serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office.
Section 4. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the elective officers and three additional members from separate chapters not already represented on the Executive Committee, to be elected by the delegates in convention assembled.
Section 5. The appointive officers shall be a Marshall and a Sentinel.
Section 6. A vacancy in office by death, resignation or any other cause, occurring between meetings of the national body shall be filled by the Executive Conmittee.

## ARTICLE VI

DUTIES OF OFFICERS
Section 1. The President shall preside at all national meetings and meetings of the Executive Committee; shall appoint all officers and committees unless otherwise speoified; shall carry out the colleotive wishes of the membership and be their spokesman on matters of national policy.
Section 2. The Vice-Fresident shall assist the President in the performance of her duties; and shall preside at the national meetings in case of the absence, resignation or removal from office of the President.
Section 3. The Secretary shall keep an accurate account of all transactions of the national meetings; write all communications; flle all papers and documents pertaining to Club transactions; issue all notices as direoted by the members in convention or the President; send notices of dues payable to every member at the beginning of the fiscal year; issue warrants to foreign sections as provided in Article IX, Section 2 of this Constitution; and perform such other duties as usually appertain to the office.
Section 4. The Treasurer shall control all moneys due this organization, having a receipt given for the same. She shall pay out the same only on regular warrants drawn by Headquarters and countersigned by the Fresident. She shall, at the annual meeting, make a financial report of the year's recelpts and expenditures.
Section 5. The Executive Committee shall act as an administrative board generally assisting the Prosident; shall have authority to act in matters of business arising between meetings not herein delegated te any other committee; shall control the policy of the Club magazine; arrange for the investment of any national funds of the organization; fix the place and the of the Annual Meeting; and give a report at the Annual Meeting of all business transacted during the year.
Section 6. The Marshall shall see that the me eting room is in order; distribute ballots; enforce order; and perform such other duties as directed by the President.
Section 7. The Sentinel shall have charge of the door, which shall be seoure at all times from intrusion; and shall admit no person who is not duly qualified to enter. She shall submit all cases of doubt to the President for her decision and obey her commands.

## ARTICLE VII <br> INSIGNIA

There shall be an official insignia for qualified meabers and it thall be point of honor for ex-members to refrain from wearing it.

## ARTICLS VIII SECTIO:18

Section 1. The membership in the United States shall be dividedirto oight units, to be knowis as Sectiones Section 2. The Sections shall be as follows
(1) Northwestern Section, composed of Waghington, Oregon, Montana, Wyoming, Horth Dakota, South Dakota, Idaho;
(2) Southwestern Section, composed of California, Arisona, Nevada, Utahs
(3) Worth Central Section, composed of Minnesots, Iow, Missouri, Illinois, Wiscons $n$, Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky
(4) South Central Section, composed of Colorado, Mew Moxico, Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Nebraska, Arkansas, Loulsiana;
(5) Hew England Section, composed of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Masachusetts, Rhode Island;
(6) Metropolitan Tri-State Section, composed of New York State, New Jersey, Connecticut;
(7) Middle Eastern Section, composed of Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, District of Columbia;
(8) Southeastern Seotion, composed of Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina.
Section 3. Sections shall be governed by a uniform Constitution which shall be adopted by the Mational Body and be issued to each section by the National Secrotary. Seotions may draw up their own By-Laws.
Section 4. A Section may subdivide to form two Sections, provided that the new Seotion contains not less then three chapters, and the old Section be left with not less than three chapters.

## ARTICLE IX <br> FORETGN SECYIONS

Section 1. Five women pilots of any foreign country, carrying the goverment license thereof, may apply for aForeign Section Charter by stating the boundaries of the proposed Section, the names of the applicants and by attaching affidavits certifying that they are goverment licensed pilots.
Section 2. Upon receipt of such application, the National Secretary shall issue warrant authorizing the formation of Foreign Section pending the approval of two-thirds of the delegates at the next Annual National Meeting.
Section 3. Upon favorable action by the National Meoting, regular charters shall be issued, duly inseribed with the names of the applicants, together with a regular Seotion Constitution.

## ARTICLE $X$ <br> COMMITRES

Section 1. The Permanent Comittees shall be the Executive Comittee, the Contest Comittee, the Auditing Committee, and the Nominating Committee.
Section 2. Temporary comittees may be appointed by the President during the Mational Moeting or when special work is to be done, as occasion may require.
Section 3. No person shall serve on more then one permanent national committee.
Section 4. All Fermanent Comittees shall submit an annual report to the Mational Meeting.

## ARTICLE XI <br> DUTILS OF COMMITTEES

Section 1. The duties of the Executive Committee shall be as stated in Article VI, Section V.
Section 2. The Contest Committee shall be composed of three members who shall at all times, work for fair competition of women flyers in all air races or aviation events. This committee shall not in any way prevent individuals from promoting their own interests at any time.
Section 3. The Auditing Comittee shall be composed of three members who shall examine the booke of the Seoretary and Treasurer and report thereon to each annual meeting.
Seotion 4. The duties of the Nominating Comittee shall be as specified in the By-Laws.

## $\frac{\text { ARTICLE XII }}{\text { AMENDIENTS }}$

Section 1. This Constitution and By-Laws may be amonded at the Annual National Meoting, provided that a copy of the proposed amendment shall have been subnitted to all sections and all chapters of each section thirty (30) days previous to the National Meeting.
Section 2. Any Constitutional amendment to beceae effective must receive a two-thirds vote of all registered delegates.

BY-LAWS OF THE NINETY-NINES
$\frac{\text { ARTICLE } I}{\text { QUORUM }}$
Sixty percent of the registered delegates shall constitute a quorum, provided that at least four Sections are represented.

# ARTICLE II <br> RRPRREBMTATIOI BY PROXY 

Any delegate unable to attend the convention may entrust her vote to any delegate by a written proxy.

\frac{\text { ARTICLE III }}{\text { MONINATIOKS }}
$$

A Nominating Comittee of five mombers shall be oleoted for the following year by direot ballot of the members, from a list of eight mombers eaoh from a different section, said list to be submitted with the regular ballot by the Nominating Comittee. The momber reoelving the largest number of votes shall serve as Chairman.

Two montis prior to the Annual Meeting this Comaittee shall submit Two names for each of the elective offices to the National Souretary. Previous to this, the Nominating Comittee shall request each seotion and each chapter to submit a list of one nome Por each of the elective officers, from whioh lists they shall select the names to be aubmitted to the Secretary.

## ARTICLS IV <br> EIECTIONS

On receipt of the list of nominees from the Nominating Comittee the National Seoretary shall mall to each member eligible to vote 30 days prior to the Annual Meoting, a numbered ballot tobe marked and returned to the Segretary. Bach ballot shall have a space for the voter to write in the name of a candidate for each office. The date for the return of the ballot shall be indicated on the ballot and ballots received after this date shall be considered void. The ballots shall be opened and counted at the Annual Fational Moeting. The President shall appoint three tellers to receive and count the ballots. On the completion of the tally the Secretary shall announce the results and if any candidate has reoeived a majority of all votes cast, the President shall declare her elected. If no candidates receive a majority of all votes cast, tha delegates shall proceed to elect from the two candidates repesiving the highest vote.

## ARTICLS $V$ <br> DUES

Sectipn 1. Dues shall be $\$ 5.00$ yearly, payable to the NINETY-NINES at its National Headquarters, to be divided as follows $\$ 4.00$ to the National Treasury, and 25 d to the treasury of the section and $75 d$ to the treasury of the chapter from wich it originates. $\$ 1.00$ initiation fee is required of new members payable to NINETY-NINES at its National Headquarters.
Section 2. Incoming members when applying for membership on or after March 1 pay one-half dues of the total year, plus initiation foe of $\$ 1.00$

## ARTICLE VI <br> SPECDAL COMATTTEES

Section 1. (a) A Credential Committee shall be appointed by the President to pass on credentials and present a list of duly qualified delegates which, when adopted, shall constitute the convention. Previous to the National Meeting the section secretaries shall forward to the National Secretary a list of the section delegates who are entitled to sit in the convention. The chapter secretaries shall forward to the National Secretary the names of their delegates elected to sit in the Annual Mooting.
Section 2. A Resolutions Comittee of three shall be appointed by the President. All resolutions must be submitted to the convention in writing and referred to the Resolutions Comittee for recomendation.

Roberts" Rules of Order shall oover all Parliamentary Procedure not otherwise provided for in this Constitution and By-Lnws.

## STANDARD CONSTITUTION FOR SECTIONS

## OF THE NINETY-NINES

[^0]$\frac{\text { ARTICIS III }}{\text { STBERSHIP }}$
There shall be three olasses of membersip in the Sections Active, Inactive and Life, as defined in Article II of the National Constitution.

## ARTICLE IV <br> OFFICERS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. Officers shall be Governor, Vice-Governor, and Seoretary-Trhaarer.
Section 2. No officer shall serve more than two oonseoutive terme in the seme office.
Section 3. Officers shall be elected yearly as provided in the By-Laws.
Section 4. The elentive officers of the seotion shall oomprise a Governor's oouncil whioh shall have authority to sot in emergencies arising between meetings of the seotion, said sots to be reported to the next regular meeting of the section for approval.
Section 5. Candidates for office shall be nominated by anditee oonsisting of one member from each chapter, appointed by the Governor. If there are no chaptere arganized, the Governor shall appoint a Nominating Comittee of Three mambers.
Section 6. The election shall be held as soon as practicable after the National Anaual Maeting and not later than October first.

## ARTICLE $V$ <br> DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The duties of the Governor shall bes To carry out the colleotive wishes of the membership and be their spokesman on matters of seotion polioys To eppoint all committees and fill offioss not otherwise provided for in the Constitution; To cooperate with the President in overy poasible way.
Section 2. The duties of the Vice-Governor shall bos To assist the Govornor in the performance of her duties; To preside at section meetings in the case of the absence, resignation or removal fiom office of the Governor.
Section 3. The duties of the Secretgry-Treasurer shall be: To keop a correct membership record; To receive and recelpt for all money due the section from National Hoadquarters and other scurces and keep an accurate account thereof; To pay all properly approved claima and bills inourred in the conduct of the business of the section, and to make at the Annual Moeting, finanoial report of the year's receipts and expenditures.

## ARTICLS VI <br> MEETINGS

Section 1. The Annual Meeting of this organization shall be held in the fall at a time and place to be desig nated by the Governor unless so designated by the members at the last previous meeting.
section 2. The Governor may call a spoial meeting at any time upan one woek's notice. The majority of chapters may demand the Governor to call apecial meeting at any time. The Governor shall issue proclamation accordingly.
Section 3. At all meetings where business is transacted each chapter within the seotion may be represented by delegates, their number being determined pro tata according to the active membership of the chapter as provided in the By-Laws; or all active section mombers may yote, according to which method gives the fairer representation to the whole membership of the section.

\frac{\text { ARTICLE VII }}{\text { DUES }}
$$

Section 1. Dues are as stated in the National Constitution.
Section 2. New members applying for membership on or after Maroh 1 pay one-half dues of the total year, plus inftiation fee of \$1.

## ARTICLE VIII <br> ORGANIZATIOX

Section 1. Each section shall govern itsolf, make desired assessments and initiate its own program, provided carrying that out does not confliot with mational policies as formulated in the National Constitution.
Section 2. Eiech section may formulate its own By-Laws.

## ARTICLE II

## CHAPTER ORGANIZATIONS

Section 1. Looal chaptors may be formed within the seotions at the deaire of the members provided not leas than five active members be necessary for the formation of a ohapter and providod that, whon a chapter is to be formed by eplitting a chaptor already in existence, approval by a two-thirde vote of the membership of the original chapter and of the offioers of the seotion in whioh said ohapter is located and of the Ereoutive Comittee of the Internntional organization shall be required to authorise suoh division of on established ohapter.

Section 2. Officers of the chapter shall be chairman, vice-chairman, secretary-treasurer, officers are to be elected in the same manner as section officers except that the nominating comittee shall be appointed by the chairman.
Section 3. The time of the chapter election shall be as soon as practicable after the section election and not later than October first.
Section 4. No chapter officer shall serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office.
Section 5. Chapter meetings are to be held monthly.
Section 6. Each chapter shall govern itself and institute its own program provided carrying that out does not conflict with section or National policies as formulated in the section or National Constitutions.

## ARTICLE $\mathbf{Z}$ <br> COMMTTTEES

Section 1. A membership committee shall be appointed annually.
Section 2. Dther committees may be appointed by the Governor as the need arises.

Section 3. The membership committee shall consist of members from each chapter. The purpose of this committee is to secure all desirable licensed women pilots for membership. This oomittee shall investigate and recommend persons for membership.

## AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended as provided in Article XII of the National Constitution.
